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This is a common opinion that the world is over populated. We do not believe all countries are equally over-populated. Over-population may be a problem of few developing countries only with a low rate of education, literacy and urbanisation which are highlighted in this article.

According to the statistical report in the year 2000, six billion people live in the world. Out of the whole population, 5 billion people live only in the developing countries. Whereas, only one million people live in the developed countries of the world. The average rate of population growth is 0.17% in the developed countries. Whereas, the average rate of population growth is from 3% to 4% in the developing countries.

The rate of population growth has come down at 1.48% step by step in some of the developing countries including Bangladesh.

In conclusion, the world is not totally over-populated. Only a few developing countries including Bangladesh are over-populated. Increased urbanisation, rate of literacy and the sense of standard of life and living, comfort in life will automatically help us about how to decrease the crude birth rate in over-populated countries. We should educate and train them in such a way that they may be transformed into skilled manpower resources.

In this way implication of the over population problem in some developing countries may be minimised.
